**A new Bishop of Bradford.** Downing Street has announced the appointment of two Area Bishops for the Diocese of West Yorkshire & the Dales. The Revd Dr Toby Howarth, currently Secretary for Inter Religious Affairs to the Archbishop of Canterbury and National Inter Religious Affairs Adviser for the Church of England will be the Bishop of Bradford. The Revd Dr Jonathan Gibbs, currently Rector of Heswall in the Diocese of Chester, will be the Bishop of Huddersfield. Toby Howarth and Jonathan Gibbs will be consecrated as bishops in a service at York Minster on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> October at 11am, conducted by the Archbishop of York.
