WHAT'S ON IN THIS PARISH...

- **St Andrew's Fair.** Thank you to everyone involved in preparing and running the fair and to those who came to support the event which was a great success. The total raised so far is £723 (approx. £100 more than last year) which is fantastic.
- **Preparing for worship during Advent**. On Sundays during Advent the choir will move to their seats just after 9.55am and we will all keep a time of quiet prayer in preparation for our worship beginning at 10.00am.
 - 'Before the service speak to God, during the service let God speak to you, after the service speak to each other.'
- **Travelling Cribs for Advent.** At the end of the 10am service today we will again send off two travelling cribs on their journey round the parish. They will return to church at the Crib Service at 4pm on Christmas Eve. Everyone is invited to host Mary & Joseph for a night; there are still spaces on the rota so please do sign one of the lists or contact Robin, 633307.
- Advent Carol Service by Candlelight, 6.00pm TODAY Sunday 30th November. Come and enjoy this special service as we begin our Advent journey towards Christmas.
- Advent Course, 'The Nativity', 7.30pm-8.45pm Wednesdays 3rd, 10th & 17th December in the Parish Rooms. This short course will use the BBC's popular fourpart drama series *The Nativity* which tells the familiar story in a fresh and contemporary way. Each week we will watch one 30 minute episode and then spend time in reflection and discussion, before ending with Night Prayer. No need to book, just come along. More details from Robin, 633307.
- **Patronal Festival Eucharist, 7.30pm NEXT Monday 1st December.** The preacher will be the Venerable David Lee, Archdeacon of Bradford. The service will followed by refreshments in the Parish Rooms.

Children are invited to come dressed as angels, shepherd, wise men or nativity animals. The service will last one hour and will take place in the church.

Receiving Communion during the winter. If you are suffering from a cough or a cold please consider intincting (dipping) your wafer in the wine, instead of receiving the wine directly from the chalice. This will minimise the risk of sharing any bugs. To intinct, simply dip the edge of the wafer briefly into the wine taking care not to put your fingertips into the wine.

WHAT'S ON ELSEWHERE...

CDFC Christmas Nativity Play, 4.00pm Sunday 14th December in Sutton Park. The main acting parts are cast. All we need now are lots of people to come to The Baptist Church in Sutton on the afternoon of Saturday 13th December for the rehearsal of the crowd scenes.
