- **Reordering of the central area of the church.** The contract for the reordering has been awarded to Enoch Harrison & Sons Ltd of Cononley. Work will begin on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September and is expected to last a maximum of 4 weeks. During the contract period the nave and north aisles will be out of bounds and Sunday services will take place in the chancel (as happened in Jan/Feb).
- **Tea & Scones and church open on Sunday afternoons.** Due to the reordering work in the church the last Sunday the church will be open for visitors will be 6<sup>th</sup> September. Tea & Scones will continue in the Parish Rooms until 27<sup>th</sup> September as planned.
