WHAT'S ON IN THIS PARISH...

Reordering of the central area of the church. The reordering is being carried out by Enoch Harrison & Sons Ltd of Cononley. Work began last Monday and is expected to last a maximum of 4 weeks. During the contract period the nave and north aisles will be out of bounds and Sunday services will take place in the chancel.

Tea & Scones and church open on Sunday afternoons. Due to the reordering work the church will not be open for visitors on Sunday afternoons. Tea & Scones will continue in the Parish Rooms until 27th September as planned.

Harvest Festival weekend, 9th - 11th October. In order to give best chance of being back in the nave the harvest festival service has been moved forward one week. The school collective worship will take place at 2.45pm on Friday 9th October and the Family Communion will take place at 10.00am on Sunday 11th October.
