Repair of the church porch roof. The PCC has applied for a faculty for the repair of the porch roof using terne-coated stainless steel. The DAC has recommended the application for approval. The Public Notices are now being displayed for the statutory 28-day public consultation period.

Harvest Festival, Thank you to everyone who supported our harvest festival celebration. The amount raised for WaterAid was **£510.70** (£283 collection + £42.30 gift aid and £184.40 auction) (*last year's total £514*). This is another excellent result – well done! This is enough to pay for the protection of a spring for 700 people with water resource management training and to pay for the training needed by one communal water and sanitation committee in Madagascar. The non-perishable goods have been taken to Skipton Food Bank.
