- **Churchyard boundary wall.** A section of the wall at the south-east corner of the churchyard (near the bottom of the car park) is bulging badly and needs to be rebuilt. Because the churchyard is a Closed Churchyard Craven District Council is responsible for its ongoing maintenance and the Council will be overseeing and financing the repair work. As an initial interim measure sandbags have been placed near the bottom of the car park to divert surface water. Further work to make the wall safe will commence as soon as possible.
