PCC Meeting, 6.30pm Tuesday 13th September. A copy of the draft agenda is on display at the back of church.

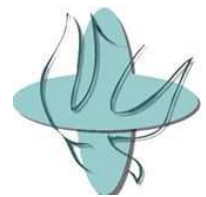
Visit by Michael Hardin of Preaching Peace, 21st - 25th September. Michael is making a welcome return to Kildwick and will be leading the following seminars:
