**Showing of film 'Closure', 6.00pm NEXT Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> September** in the Parish Rooms. *Closure* is a film inspired by true stories of Iranian Christian martyrs. 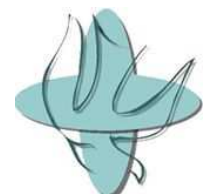
