- **René Girard:** *The Scandal of Christianity in Evolution and Conversion: Dialogues on the Origins of Culture*

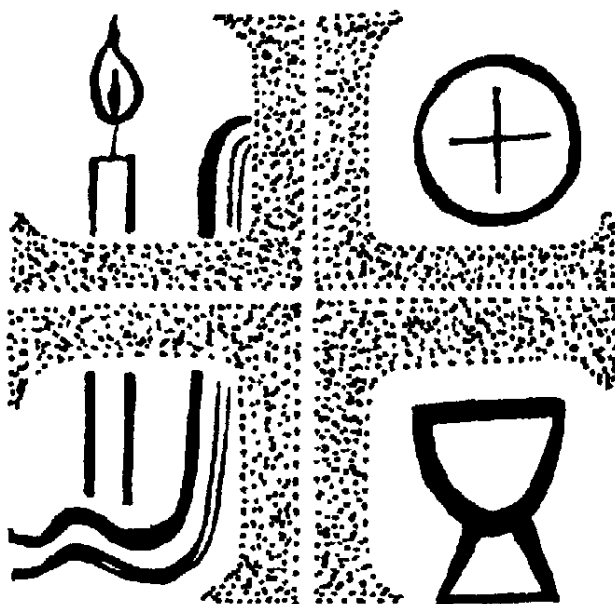
